MARKING

Clicker pointed awl

Wing/compass **divider**

Steel rule - 6", 12" and 3ft marked in both metric and imperial Metal safety rule

Metal tape measure

Fabric tape measure – for curves, but can stretch Set square Silver gel pen

CUTTING

Round knife Single head knife Clicker knife (with replaceable curved and straight blades)

Stanley knife

Paring knife – for skiving/thinning edges Snips – for thread Strap cutter - adjustable width for cutting leather strips, eg for belts Plough gauge - for cutting heavier leather, 3mm+ Wooden board - end grain preferable Cutting mat Litho or marble stone - for skiving Round and oval hole punches Wad punches – for larger sized holes Revolving hole punch I to 5mm holes Chisel punch - for creating shaped ends, eg belts Crew punch - for creating hole for buckle tongue various sizes, common are sizes 37/38/39

STITCHING

Pricking wheel – common 7 stitches to the inch, some have interchangeable wheels Stitch marker/pricking iron – most common is 7 stitches to the inch in 2-tooth, 1/2", 1" and 1.5" widths (other sizes available from 14 to inch to 5 to inch)

Race/stitch groover – cuts a groove for embedding stitches and aids bending leather Wooden mallet for stitch marking, round punches

Tacks

Tack hammer – for tacks and aids bending leather Diamond awl blades - from 1"-3" length for saddle stitching, 1.75" for 7 stitches to inch **Stabbing awl** – sharp round end for thin leather Oval or sewing awl handles - for awl blades Harness needles - blunt for saddle stitching, size 3 for 3/18, size 4 for 3/25 Glovers needles - sharp for stitching soft leather, size 3 standard Beeswax Pliers - for pulling needles through if stiff Saddlers clams - to hold work in place Stitching pony – as above, smaller version FINISHING Edge tool – from I (narrow) to 6 (wide) Skirt shave - from 1/4" wide Creasing tool - to add traditional line along edge Loop irons or sticks – for shaping loops/keepers Broken glass - for shaving edges Sanding block – for smoothing edges Gum tragacanth for burnishing edges **Gum tragacanth** – for lubricating edge for burnishing (saliva can be alternative!) Wool dauber - for gum and dye Horn/bone folders for creasing, moulding and burnishing Waxed canvas cloth – for burnishing Fiebings spirit dye – for dying leather Fiebings edge stain - for dying leather edges Edge Kote - acrylic paint for edges Resolene - for sealing dyed edges

SHARPENING

Oilstone Strop – for sharpening knives and awls Carborundum powder – for strop Tallow – for strop

GLUE

PVA – wood glue can go crispy when dry (pros use Sheppy M200 glue) Neoprene contact adhesive



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Thread

Linen thread traditionally used in saddlery for hand-stitching. Common brands include Barbours and Somac. Also Wenzel in smaller qty. Useful sizes are 3/25 and 3/18 for 7 stitches to the inch. Usual colours are white, black, brown and yellow on 50g reel or 250g COP. Can get red, blue, beige and green from Le Prevo. Waxed linen thread in many colours avail from US on eBay.

🖙 Leather

Different type of tanning – common is veg tan and chrome tan Can be dyed through or natural on back and edges. Veg tan (recommended) can be burnished on edges, chrome tan cannot and has to be painted with edge dye. Russet leather: basic tanned leather without any colouring

good for moulding and tooling can be dyed wide range of substance (thickness) from 1.1mm-4mm (3mm good for tools) can change colour (darken) when exposed to sun or if handled

Leather from different parts of animal:

shoulder is softer, cheaper and more flexible, can have obvious creases in leather

butt is taken from back of animal, stronger, less flexible, smoother, more expensive

Bridle leather traditionally used in saddlery, quite expensive, smooth, waxy surface, usually 3.5/4mm thick
